

General Order No. 1 March 26, 2023 Knoxville, Tennessee

To the officers and Knights of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Tennessee, and to the officers and Knights of the Constituent Commanderies thereof:

Sir Knights,

"For I would not have you ignorant, brethren, concerning them which are asleep, that ye sorrow not, even as others which have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him... For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God; and the dead in Christ shall rise first: then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air; and so shall we ever be with the Lord. Wherefore comfort one another with these words." (I Thess. 4:13-18)

As we approach Holy Week and remember the sacrifice of our Lord, we know that the story did not end at the grave. The Second Fundamental Characteristic of a Templar, Selflessness


Last month we discussed the concept of **Character**, the first of the four indispensable characteristics of a Templar; Character, Selflessness, Excellence, and Engagement. This month we will take a look at the vital Templar trait of **Selflessness**.

This behavior is the consistent and unrelenting behavior of always putting the welfare, happiness, and interests of others above our own. In the Craft Lodge, we affirm that we desire to "learn to subdue our passions." If you think about it, unsubdued passions are almost always an expression of our own selfishness. Selfishness is a trait that we are all subject to because we are human. As cute, loveable, and adorable as babies are, we must admit that they are totally selfish. With them, it is "all about me." They are either hungry, wet, sick, uncomfortable, or just unhappy much of the time, especially if things don't go to suit them. As humans, this is where we all start, and we have to work to learn how to get along with our fellowman.

Many never learn to subdue their passions. For this reason, even some members of our Lodges never really achieve the true character of a Master Mason. A man who is master of himself. This should never be the case with a Templar. The standards of selflessness for a Templar are on a much higher plane, and each of us must constantly strive to focus on this trait, whether we are driving, in a business meeting, waiting on an elevator, or dealing with our irritating relatives and fraternal brethren. This is a constant struggle which never ends.

He who has learned selfless behavior is perceived by others as being a strong individual who should be respected and even admired. Selflessness is always a characteristic of a hero. If we constantly practice the trait of selflessness, there will be no dissention or hard feelings among us which cannot be immediately resolved to every brother's satisfaction; so, the next time you perceive a conflict among the brethren, ask yourself which one(s) involved have forgotten their responsibilities as a Templar to behave in a selfless manner. Righteous indignation is incompatible with the trait of selflessness. If we seek justice, it should usually be for others who have been wronged, not ourselves.

Also we should always remember never to base our self esteem on the opinions of others. Our self esteem should be based on the degree to which we are able to exhibit the true characteristics of a Templar. Other's opinions are really not our concern and are usually not worth arguing with them about. This makes for a much more pleasant and satisfying lifestyle.


