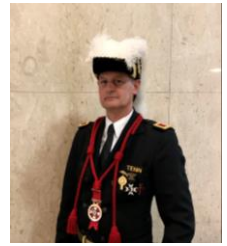

## **The First Fundamental Characteristic of a Templar – Character**

Last month, I mentioned that the four indispensable and basic characteristics of a Templar are Character, Selflessness, Excellence, and Engagement. This month, we are going to discuss the concept of **Character**.

Character consists of two components, **Integrity** and **Morality**. Integrity is the degree to which our actions match our espoused beliefs. Sometimes it is described as “walking the talk.” Even in the craft Lodge we are prepared for this by hearing our ancient Grand Master affirm that “My life you may take, but my integrity, never.” This is a true statement. Others can take our possessions, our family, our health, and even our lives, but to lose our integrity, we must voluntarily give it away.

This is associated with Stephen Covey’s concept of developing the habit of “proactivity.” Being proactive is the opposite of being a victim. Our society is filled to the brim with victims, those who allow others to control their lives. You see, being a victim is something people choose to do.

One example of this is being offended. It seems that in our society today, we have a lot of folks who are offended by one thing or another. Being offended is bad for us, both psychologically and physically. It causes anger, raises our blood pressure, and generally harms us in the long run. So, if we let others offend us, we are turning our wellbeing over to the person who is offending us. In fact, we can choose not to be offended. This is fundamental to controlling our passions, and choosing not to let others offend us is an unbelievably liberating experience.

What this means is that we choose to have integrity. No one else can make that choice for us. Integrity is a hallmark of the Templar. What he says, he does, every time, no exceptions. We as Templars are bound by his honor as a Knight to keep this constantly on our minds never to let our integrity slip for any reason.

Integrity alone does not constitute character. You see, many of the terrorists we see in our world have very high integrity. They proclaim loudly that “infidels” must convert or die, and then they plot to kill those who disagree with them. That’s high integrity, but it is not character. It lacks morality. Many would have us believe that morality in today’s world is relative, that what is right and wrong depends on the circumstances and your own mood.

In Templary, there should be no confusion about morality. We base our morality squarely and exclusively on the *Holy Bible*, especially the *New Testament*. As American Templars, our two most important documents are the *Holy Bible* and the *Constitution of the United States of America*. We affirm this at every tiled meeting.

Our lives are based as Christians on faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, remember that He never advocated “relative” morality and that He lived an exemplar life of morality upon which we, as Templars, must base our lifestyle. In order to have morality as part of our lifestyle, we must know without question upon what it is based. We must have the internal resolve to “control our passions” and the courage as Templars to resist the forces of evil which constantly assail us in an effort to convince us that it is “okay” to deviate from Divine law, “just this once.”
