Christian Chivalric Values

Part 5

Sir Knights, as you may recall, we have been publishing a series of articles concerning the “Christian Chivalric Values” as set forth by Sir Knight Richard Van Dorn. The fifth value in the list is “A commitment to put on the whole armor of God and ride forth every day.” This month, our Southwest Battalion Commander, Sir Knight James Weir, has written the following article in support and explanation of this Knightly value.

Fight for the Cross

There are certain moments that capture us – where we feel God’s grace blanket us with perfect peace that surpasses all reason. I remember the birth of my first child, looking at her face, flooded with emotions and thoughts and thanksgiving. There was this one thought that hit me, and once it did, I cried like a, well, like a baby. Here I am holding this baby; she has no idea who I am, nor does she even care. All this baby does is cry and whine and moan for comfort. She is not capable of understanding love or sacrifice. She only wants what she wants and when she wants it. This little baby that I am holding in my hands has no clue who I am or how much I love her. I would instantly and freely die for her. A child can never love their parent more than a parent loves their child. This is the moment I understood the fatherhood of God – loving, teaching, disciplining, sacrificing. Perhaps the biggest temptation a father has to face is fighting your children’s battles versus teaching them to fight for themselves.

God can, with one blink of an eye or flick of a finger, completely rid Satan and all demons out of the world and out of our way. Instead of doing that, He blesses us with the task of fighting for the victories. It is a blessing, though it may seem like a curse, and I do not completely understand it myself, but in His unfathomable wisdom, more glory will come to Him, and more joy will come to us in fighting for this triumph. The problem is this – we spend too much time playing defense and very little time attacking. We do not fight; we find it easier to react. Never has there been more powerful and victorious warriors who can win battles over forces far stronger than the armies on earth, yet at the same time are so weak and timid when mere darts are tossed at us by the culture.

God could do it so easily without us. He could just get rid of the devil, so that all we had to deal with is human flesh. But he has not chosen to get rid of the devil, yet. He will throw the devil into the lake of fire someday, but now, God lets him run on a leash, doing great damage in the world because of the original sin. What are we called to do with this? How can we best live a life worthy of the crown, knowing that our fight is not against flesh and blood but against demons and Satan himself.

As knights we have armor; we have a sword, and most of the time when we sin or fall into temptation, it is because we did not put on the armor and pick up the sword. Ephesians 6 tells us to be strong in the Lord and in

the strength of His might, to put on the whole armor of God. Strength is an important theme in scripture. You see it over and over again, especially in Ephesians. Paul talks about strengthening the inner man in Ephesians 3, and now in chapter 6 he is telling us again that we must be strong. but notice what kind of strength he is referring to, “Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of His might.”

It is not our strength. He is not saying, “Come on, let us recruit big strong men; let us build tanks, and bombers.” That is not the kind of strength he is talking about. It is in the Lord. It is the Lord’s strength in you. His strength is made perfect in our weakness (2 Corinthians 12:9). He is calling for you to experience a strength that is not your own. Perhaps that may be a reason our enemy is still allowed to attack, that we may rest in God’s grace and gain our strength from Christ alone.

We must actually pick up the sword and wear the armor; we must fight for the right and against all wrong, never settling for what is, but always striving for what could be. Every day, not just the days when we will feel good or it is convenient, but every day we must be who we were created to be – warriors of the cross.

Ironically, or rather strangely, you do not get the strength by putting on the armor. A soldier does not ordinarily get strength or courage from putting on armor. Courage and strength are in his nature; the armor simply protects him. It is not the driving force for being brave. Ephesians says to “put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil.” In our case, our strength and courage are placed in us by our all-powerful God Himself.

The word “stand” is repeated a few times here. He wants us to stand firm in the gospel and in God’s grace. We are to stand firm against the schemes of the enemy. The devil has schemes in England; he has schemes in Minneapolis, schemes in South America, schemes in Memphis, Tennessee. The Greek word here is “methodeias,” the same word from which we get our word “method.” The devil has methods that he tailor-fits, not just for countries, but cities, streets, and individuals. He has Russian method, a Washington D.C. method, a Maple Street or Main Street, USA method. He has got a middle-class method, and he has got a wealthy method, and a poor method. He has a method specific to you, no doubt, with methods tailor-made for your situation to mess you up – to make you weak, to make you fall down, to ruin your life.

You can never say, “Oh, if I could just get enough money, I would be free from greed. Or if I could just live in the right place, I would be happy. Or if I could become a missionary, I would be free from doubt. Or if I could not have a computer, I would be free from the temptations.” The enemy always has a new method for your new situation. He has methods and schemes, and we have to have armor so that we can discern and figure out how to be protected against them.

“We do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places” (Ephesians 6:12). Remember what Jesus said in John 18:36 when Pilate asked Him if He was the king. He said, “If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world.”

The kingdom of Jesus does not advance with weapons, contrary to terrible aspects in the history of Christendom. It does not advance with bombs or barbed wire. It is not a flesh and blood issue. It is a demonic, angelic, evil power that is to be fought here with this armor. I want you to be really tuned in to this because this should be sobering for you. You are the warrior that does the fighting. If you are wondering, how do I fight the

devil? How do I gain victory in my life over addiction, grief, or sickness? How can I protect my children from the devil? How can I keep myself free from Satan? How can I get free from the claws of temptation? The answer is here – glory, grace, and the gospel.

Stay true to the gospel, and “take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth” (Ephesians 6:13). A belt wraps completely around you and buckles firmly in place, so should the truth of God’s word surround you and buckle you in. If you are wrapped in truth, then you will also be true. The opposite of a true word is falsehood. The opposite of a true life is hypocrisy. Are you a true person?

“Put on the breastplate of righteousness” (Ephesians 6:14). I am apt to think by the wording and the way he uses the word “righteousness” here, that Paul is not necessarily referring to the imputed righteousness of Christ to us. The way he uses the word here, expresses more of a challenge. What does righteousness bring about in our life? Here, we are challenged to live in the joy and the deliverance of the righteousness in our lives. Are you living joyously, or are you so focused on what you do not have that you lose focus of what blessings you do have?

Shield yourself. “In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one” (Ephesians 6:15). Faith shields darts coming at you. You see them coming at you, and they stick in the shield. They burn out because they can not catch the shield on fire. Now, here is the question, Faith in what? Darts will come, but fiery darts can come at you at that moment of disappointment, or regret, or anger, or fear, or loneliness, or incapacitating grief. When you put up the shield of faith, practically, what do you really do? What do you believe? What does faith believe at that moment? It stands firm knowing that no matter how much doubt there is in God, at the moment you still believe. You still know that your pain is not just profound but has an eternal purpose, God’s glory and your good.

For none of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself. For if we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord’s. To this end, Christ died and lives again, that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living. “To live is Christ, and to die is gain” (Philippians 1:21).

If death is gain, if the fight brings glory to our King, and if the kingdom is eternal, then how can we stay silent? Why do we remain still? If the courage is in us, if the war has already been won, if we cannot lose, then why do we shrink back in fear of what others think? Let us fight with the hearts of knights for His glory; let us press forward to victory sealed by His grace, and let us strive for the gospel in our lives. Surrendering is not an option. We must pick up our sword and buckler, and remember our vows of knighthood. We must fight for the cross; we must fight because that is what we were created to do.

Next month’s chivalric value will be “An impetus to come to the rescue of others, no matter their circumstances.”

Brief History of Knights Templar in Tennessee

Nashville No. 1, at Nashville, received a dispensation in November of 1846 from Deputy Grand Master Joseph K. Stapleton and was granted a charter on September 16, 1847.

Yorkville No. 2, at Yorkville, received a Dispensation from Grand Master W. B. Hubbard on July 10, 1857 and was granted a charter on September 17, 1859.

DeMolay No. 3, at Columbia, received a dispensation from Grand Master W. B. Hubbard on December 20, 1857, and was granted a charter on September 16, 1859.

Cyrene No. 4, at Memphis, received a dispensation from Grand Master W. B. Hubbard on March 27, 1859, and was granted a charter on September 16, 1859.

The formation of the Grand Commandery of Tennessee was approved by the Grand Encampment on September 16, 1859. On October 3, 1859, Grand Master B. B. French issued a warrant for that purpose, designating Sir Lucius J. Polk as his proxy. The Grand Commandery was constituted on October 12, 1859. Sir Charles A. Fuller was elected as the first Grand Commander. In 1948 there were twenty four Commanderies and 4,997 members. As of January 2024, there are twenty eight Commanderies, including one under dispensation, and 2,653 members.

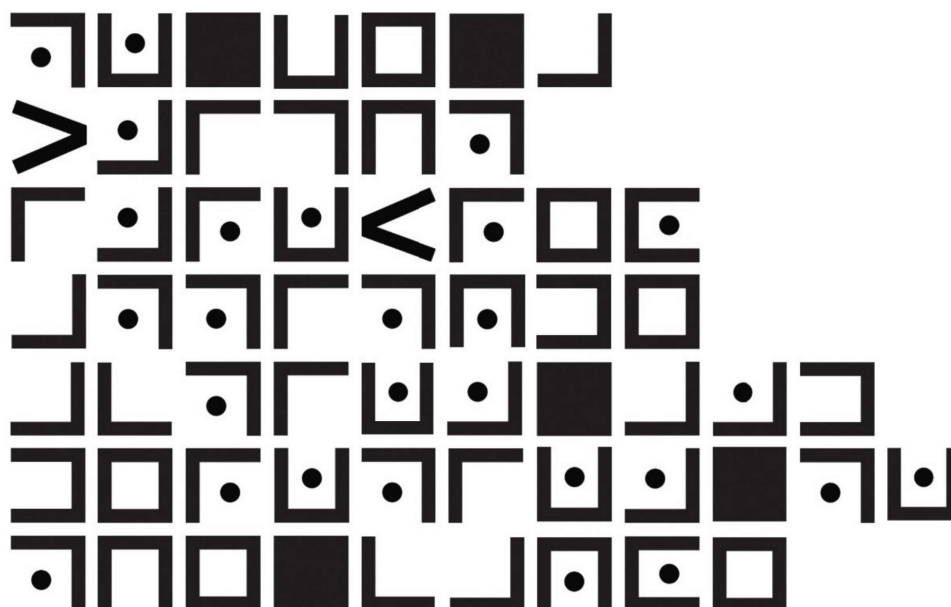
