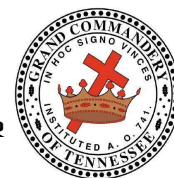

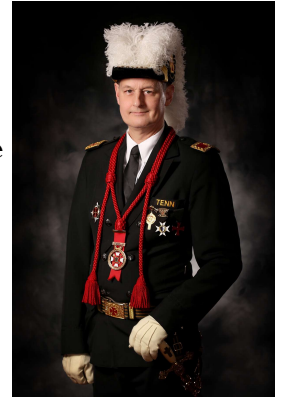

Christian Chivalric Values

Part 4

In the October issue, we began a series of articles on the "**Christian Chivalric Values**" as set forth by Sir Knight Richard Van Dorn, the first of which is, "***A firm belief in the Lord Jesus Christ and His church.***" In November, we examined the second of these values, "***The courage to confront evil despite the odds of success.***" Last month we discussed "***A commitment to those less fortunate.***" The fourth value is "***A desire to do what is right and modestly disclaim personal aggrandizement.***"

Sometimes I worry about our organization when it comes to this value. I look around, and sometimes the class "A" uniforms I see around me (including and especially mine) look like something that would be worn by a general in a third world country. We seem to be obsessed by medals, ribbons, and shoulder cords. This is one of the reasons I have come to prefer the simple cap and mantle uniform, without all the medals.

What the Grand Encampment and the Grand Commandery have discovered is that if they want the Sir Knights to do something, all they have to do is give a medal for it. We have medals for contributing to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, the Holy Land Pilgrimage, and the Grand Encampment permanent fund; for signing petitions and attending Grand Encampment conclaves, not to mention for service to the order.

Do not get me wrong, I believe in rewarding those who serve our order, but it troubles me some that I get the feeling that sometimes, we only serve or donate in order to get the medal. Whatever happened to service "without the hope of fee or reward?"

The true Knight does what is right simply because it is the right thing to do. He takes the initiative to serve others without being asked. He is the guy who cleans the dining hall before the Commandery meeting and sets up the asylum for degrees the afternoon before. He is the Brother who volunteers to cook the meal or who repairs the paraphernalia or even the toilet, if need be.

I sometimes hear from our Knights who seldom attend that, "I am not a ritualist and can't memorize, so I can't contribute." Remember that our mission is to provide every Knight with a "quality chivalric experience." If the only experience we are providing our Knights is the initiatory experience, we are completely missing the boat. That experience should also include quality meals, enjoyable fellowship, educational opportunities, family events, moving religious experiences, and opportunities to serve others within and outside our officially

sponsored charities. None of these things involve memorization or ritual performance. What about storing, cleaning, and repairing our paraphernalia or setting things up for conferrals?

Sometimes these jobs don't seem as attractive as performing ritual, but each one is vital to the chivalric experience.

How about those who visit our widows or shut-in Knights? Even a phone call is almost always appreciated. If you don't attend Commandery, does anyone call you and encourage you to come? That somebody could be you. We have programs to present to the Blue Lodges but no one to present them. We have committees which do not function because no one will volunteer to serve on them.

Every one of us has something to offer toward the accomplishment of our mission, and every one of us can achieve great satisfaction in doing so "without the hope of fee or reward."

As Templars, we should all be seeking every opportunity to serve Christ, our community, our Commandery, and our Brother Knights, not for recognition or medals, but out of gratitude that we have been permitted to achieve the rank of "Knight" and the opportunity to serve.

I sometimes think that many of our members open their dues notice each year and ask themselves the question, "What am I getting for these dues I keep paying?" The answer is simple, "Absolutely nothing of value." You see, that was the wrong question. Our order does not exist for us to spoon feed each other pleasant experiences. It doesn't exist to provide a one-time entertainment experience by conferring the orders. It doesn't exist so that our members can brag that they are "Knights Templar."

It exists to give us the opportunity to unite together in service of Christianity, of our fellow creatures, of our society, and of each other. If you want something other than bragging rights out of your Templar experience, then you need to get engaged with your Commandery in the service of others.

I am providing a list of the membership chairmen in each of our Commanderies and their e-mail addresses. If you are not currently engaged in the activities of your Commandery and if you want something out of your affiliation with Templary other than bragging rights, I urge you to contact your membership chairman and ask him where you can plug in and fulfill a role that is useful to your Commandery. If he can't give you a satisfactory answer, then call me – I can. Once you get into that role and start working, I can guarantee a fulfilling chivalric experience.

Next month Sir Knight James Weir will write about the Christian Chivalric value of "A commitment to put on the whole armor of God and ride forth every day."

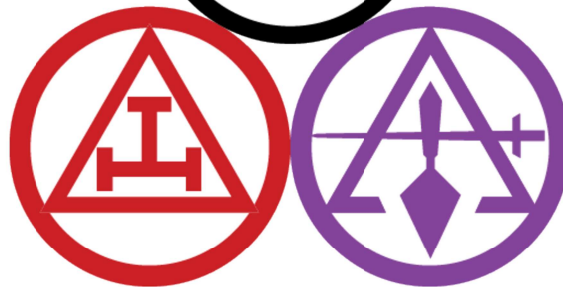

New Year Reminders

With the dawn of the new year and the election of new Commandery officers, it is only fitting that we remind ourselves and our new Knights of the Commandery basics. In the pages that follow you will find what offices comprise an Asylum of Knights Templar as well as the duties and locations of each respective office. While these duties are not currently part of our opening ritual, it is a good idea to know the duties of each officer. In the coming months we will delve deeper into each office to help as an educational tool for all of our Sir Knights.

Also included is a diagram showing the layout of an Asylum. The layout was included in last months newsletter, but there were revisions that needed to be made. If you have already saved a copy of the layout from last month, then please update your records with this most recent version. As shown below, you will see the Sentinel is listed on both sides of the Asylum. This is done because it depends on the layout of the particular lodge room as to where the entry and exit door is located.

You will also see below the most up to date listing of the Commandery meeting schedule. The schedule includes associated meetings and meal times, if applicable. As meeting and meal times periodically change, please pass along your most recent schedule so that we can ensure that everyone has the most up-to-date information.

While this newsletter is intended to promote Templary in Tennessee, please inform us of any Chapter or Council degrees or Commandery Orders that your bodies are performing. This newsletter will be distributed on the first of every month, and with advanced notice, the conferral information will be included so that support can be given where it is needed statewide.

Offices and Duties

OFFICERS: The officers within a Commandery consist of: Commander, Generalissimo, Captain General, Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Prelate, Treasurer, Recorder, Standard Bearer, Sword Bearer, Warder, Sentinel, and Three Guards.

Commander: In the East or at the head of the Commandery.

To distribute alms to poor and weary Pilgrims traveling from afar, feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and bind up the wounds of the afflicted; to inculcate the duties of charity and hospitality and govern the Commandery with justice and moderation.

Generalissimo: On the right of the Commander.

To assist the Commander in the duties of his office and in his absence to preside.

Captain General: On the left of the Commander.

To see that due preparation is made for the conclaves of the Commandery, that the Asylum is in suitable array for the introduction of candidates and the dispatch of business, to execute the orders of the Commander, and in his absence and that of the Generalissimo, to preside.

Senior Warden: At the south-west angle of the triangle, on the right or in front of the First Division when separately formed, and on the right of the Commandery when in line.

To attend Pilgrim Warriors, comfort and support Pilgrim Penitents, and after due trial, introduce them into the Asylum.

Junior Warden: At the north-west angle of the triangle, on the right or in front of the Third Division when separately formed, and on the left of the Commandery when in line.

To attend poor and weary Pilgrims traveling from afar, accompany them on their journey, and in due time recommend them to the Commander.

Prelate: On the right of the Generalissimo.

To minister at the alter and offer up prayers to Deity.

Treasurer: On the right, and in front of the Generalissimo.

To receive in charge all funds and property of the Commandery, pay all orders drawn on the Treasury, and render a true account when required.

Recorder: On the left, and in front of the Captain General.

Faithfully to record the transactions of the Commandery, collect the revenue, and pay it over to the Treasurer.

Standard Bearer: In the West, and in the center of the Second Division.

To display, support, and protect the banner of our order.

Why stationed in the West?

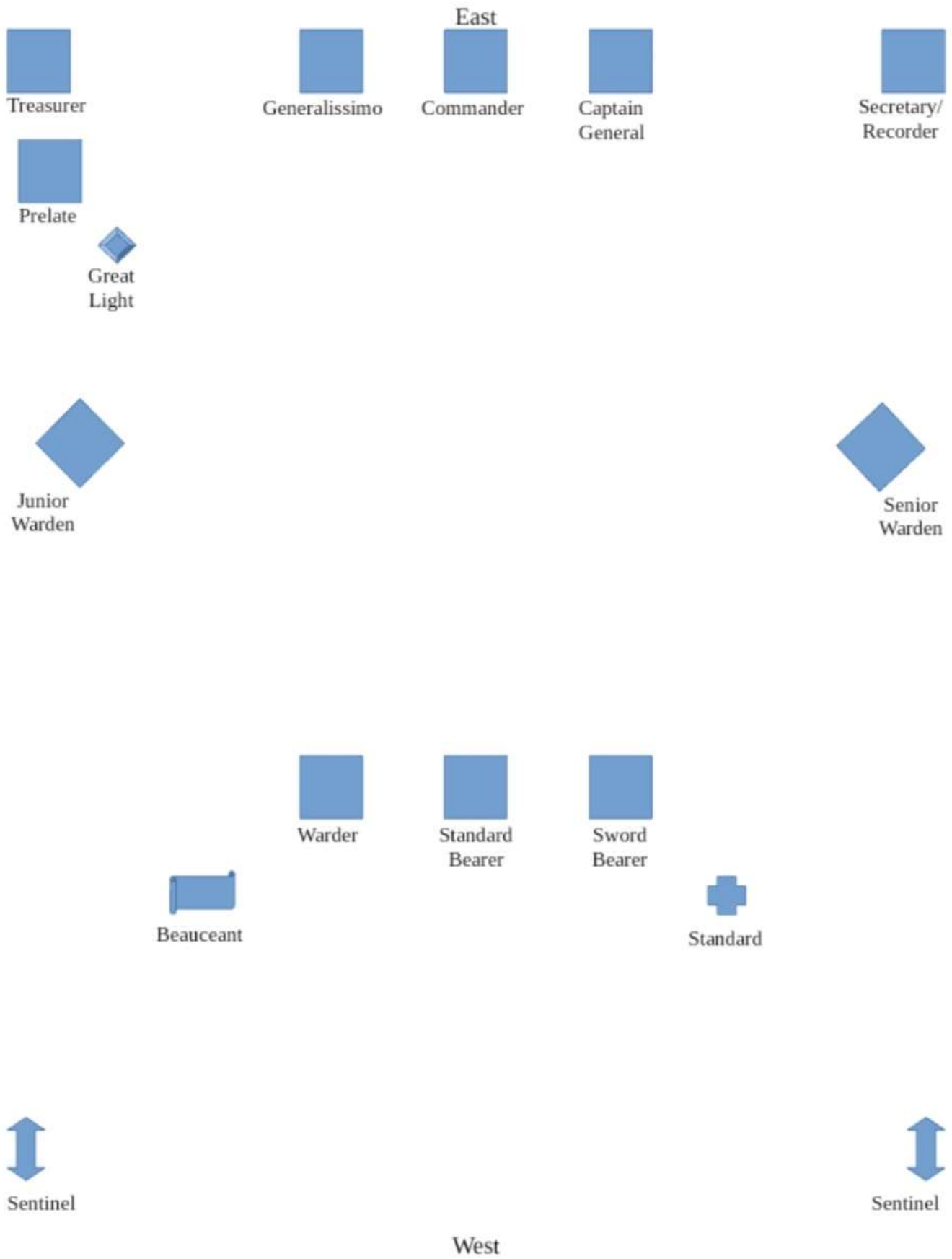
That the brilliant rays of the rising sun, shedding lustre upon the banner of our order, may animate and encourage all valiant and magnanimous Knights and dismay and confound their enemies.

Sword Bearer: On the right of the Standard Bearer, and on the right of the Second Division when separately formed.

To assist in protecting the banner of our order.

Warder: On the left of the Standard Bearer and on the left of the Second Division when separately formed.

To sound the assembly, post the Sentinel, announce the approach and departure of the Commander, and see that the asylum is duly guarded.

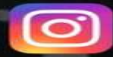
